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LAPORTE COUNTY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING MINUTES AUGUST 25, 2025

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:10 pm by President Adam Koronka.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

President Koronka asked all to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

Auditor Michael Rosenbaum called the roll and noted that all were present and a guorum was reached.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Councilman Kessler asked that 2 corrections be made -

- Remove Surveyor request
- ➤ Minor Correction transfer is going from 2500 to 2501

Councilman Novak asked that Purdue Extension be corrected to reflect a transfer from the 100 accounts, not an additional appropriation.

A motion was made by Mr. Kessler and supported by Mr. Novak.

The vote was unanimous. 7-0

APPROVAL OF JULY 28, 2025 MEETING MINUTES

A motion to approve the July 28, 2025 minutes was made by Councilman Yagelski and supported by Councilman Pressel.

The motion passed 7 - 0.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Steve Holifield talked about a personal emergency and commended several individuals for their work. He then congratulated LaPorte School's teacher, Marty Briggs for his recognition by the state as a candidate for teacher of the year.

He's also holding another town hall in Michigan City at City Hall.

Former Mayor Leigh Morris spoke about the stained glass in the court house and requested help with restoring and preserving them. A discussion took place and will be ongoing.

A motion to support sending this back to the Commissioners was made by Councilman Kiel and supported by Councilman Novak and Pressel. Motion passed 7 - 0.

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS

IT Department Head, Darlene Hale passed out a proposal from Integrated Technologies. She and Councilman Yagelski explained the proposal for copiers in the county. The analysis will be free.

A motion was made by Councilman Novak to support the analysis and supported by Councilman Kiel. The motion passed 7-0.

Parks & Rec – Park Superintendant Jeremy Sobecki updated the council on the upgrades provided by the Park Foundation.

Attorney Guy DiMartino approached the council to inform them of 2 issues he was bringing before them. The first was concerning insurance and the second issue is building maintenance. The Commissioner's budget also needs an additional \$150,000 for legal fees.

Recorder Bilderback spoke about the fund and the council's right to use it.

A motion was made by Councilman Yagelski to read by title only. The motion was supported by Councilman Novak. Motion was approved on a 7-0 vote.

The Ordinance was read by title only by Auditor Rosenbaum.

A motion to approve Ordinance 2025-8 was made by Councilman Novak and supported by Councilman Mollenhauer. The motion passed 7-0.

A motion to suspend the rules and hear the ordinance on second reading was made by Councilman Novak and supported by Councilman Kessler. Motion passed 7-0.

A motion was made by Councilman Novak to read by title only. The motion was supported by Councilman Kessler. Motion was approved on a 7-0 vote.

The Ordinance was read by title only by Auditor Rosenbaum.

A motion to approve Ordinance 2025-8 was made by Councilman Novak and supported by Councilman Kessler. The motion passed 7-0.

• PUBLIC HEARING IDENTIFYING AND CONFIRMING PORTIONS OF THE LAPORTE COUNTY, INDIANA BE DESIGNATED AS AN ECONOMIC REVITALIZATION AREA.

Matt Reardon approached the council to explain the ERA. Public Hearing was opened by President Koronka who announced 3 times that the hearing was opened and then closed after no questions were asked by the public. Questions were then opened to the council.

Councilman Kiel asked if the road in front of the property would be given to the county. The answer was yes. Also, Mr. Kiel asked if the owner would be using Union Labor – the response was they would be using local labor, but did not know if it would be union or not. A discussion took place between Mr. Yagelski and the business owner.

A Resolution of the LaPorte County Council Identifying and Confirming Portions of the LaPorte

A motion was made by Councilman Yagelski to read by title only and supported by Councilman Kessler. The Resolution was read by title only by Auditor Rosenbaum.

Motion to approve Resoultion 2025-8 was made by Mr. Yagelski and supported by Mr. Novak. Motion passed 7 – 0.

Mr. Reardon then asked that the council approve the statement of benefits so that the public hearing can be held and the 5 year abatement can be approved.

A motion was made by Councilman Novak to approve the benefits and it was supported by Councilman Yagelski. The motion passed 7-0.

 Wanatah Public Library Additional Appropriation/Don Parker Advertised 8/15/2025

Don Parker, director of the Wanatah Public Library, addressed the council asking for an additional appropriation of \$25,000 for additional salaries, new furniture and some miscellaenous expenses.

President Koronka asked about the Library's cash reserve. Mr. Parker said they expected to have a cash reserve of \$224,000.00.

A motion to approve was made by Councilman Novak and supported by Councilman Kessler. The motion was approved on a 7 - 0 vote.

HR Director, Monique Thomas -

Job Evalution Committee Recommendations:

- E-911 Assistant Director salary be removed off the scale and classified as an Unclassified position with exempt status. Salary recommendation at \$74,000 annually.
 - Councilman Novak explained the request. A discussion took place between Ms. Huston and the council.
 - Because the council felt more information was needed, It was agreed among the council members to hold this over until the Public Hearing on Budgets is held.
- Adult Probation classifying the MC Adult Probation Secretary from COMOT IV to V. Lyn Swanson approached the council to explain this request. Because the council felt more information was needed, It was agreed among the council members to hold this over until the Public Hearing on Budgets is held.

Attorney DiMartino approached the council to discuss the needs of Building Maintenance. Councilman Yagelski suggested taking \$100,000 from the 100 accounts that has not been used yet this year and put it into the accounts that need it.

President Koronka said he wanted to discuss how we got here. "We have a budget, the amount budgeted has been repeated several times over the last several years. (In the county), we issue the work to be done, receive the invoice and not paying attenion to what we have to spend in the budget. So, we're not paying attention. Where I come from, we issue a P.O. based on a proposal, then get an invoice based on the P.O. and after the work is done, the P.O. process includes reviewing what we have for additional supporting funds. We don't have that here and we need to resolve that in this county."

Attorney DiMartino added to the discussion and said that we are being reactive not proactive. We have older buildings that need attention. Councilman Novak talked about the maintenance committee that is now addressing the problems. There is a plan to make things better and address preventive maintenance. The committee is looking at oursourcing some of the maintenance. The discussion continued with Councilman Kiel adding to the conversation.

A motion was made by Councilman Mollenhauer to approve the additional appropriation of \$250,000 from Fund 1112 LIT Economic Development and support was made by Councilman Kessler. The motion passed 6 – 1 with Councilman Kiel dissenting.
